## Psalm 27:6

## Main idea:

Thanksgiving is born out of confidence in God's goodness.

How do we have confidence that God is good?

→ Knowledge of God and His work

What is a healthy Biblical expectation for God's activity?

→ The salvation of His people

## Ephesians 1:5-10

In love <sup>5</sup> he predestined us for adoption to himself as sons through Jesus Christ, according to the purpose of his will, <sup>6</sup> to the praise of his glorious grace, with which he has blessed us in the Beloved. <sup>7</sup> In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace, <sup>8</sup> which he lavished upon us, in all wisdom and insight <sup>9</sup> making known to us the mystery of his will, according to his purpose, which he set forth in Christ <sup>10</sup> as a plan for the fullness of time, to unite all things in him, things in heaven and things on earth.

We look at the world and God's activity in it through the lens of His salvific purpose.

1) Adoption (care and love) Romans 8

Matthew 6:26 Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they?

2) Sanctification (change) 1 Peter 1:3-4

How to grow in thanksgiving:

- Read Scripture,
- Interact with God,
- Evaluate testimonies,
- Live in community,

Knowledge of who God is and what He does leads us to an attitude of thanksgiving.

A heart of thanksgiving results in:

- 1) Changed perception And now my head shall be lifted up above my enemies all around me,
- 2) Personal transformation and I will offer in his tent sacrifices with shouts of joy;
- 3) Persistent worship I will sing and make melody to the LORD.
